Adoption of Ballarat Regional Athletic Centre Inc (A0016590P)

'Rules of Incorporation'

SUMMARY



For approval via special resolution are changes to the Ballarat Regional Athletic Centre Inc (A0016590P) Rules of Incorporation, specifically:

- a. That 'Ballarat Regional Athletic Centre Inc' (A0016590P) adopts its own rules of incorporation to:
 - i. Reflect change of name
 - ii. Ensure rules align the changes in structure approved last year.
 - Better reflect our actual member base to legally include individual and life members.

This briefing document shall outline the background and justification of the resolution, as well as the proposed changes. For clarity to members, changes have been categorised as:

- Changes identified that relate to minor inconsistencies with standard Model Rules.
- 2. Changes required that reflect the approved board restructure.
- 3. Changes required to deliver strategic objectives, aligned to the BRAC Strategic Plan 2023-2026+

Background



As part of the Ballarat Regional Athletic Centre Inc (BRAC) transition from a committee of management to a skills based board in 2023, a review of its Rules of Incorporation was required to ensure that the new structure is reflected within the governing documents, and the governing documents allow BRAC to meet its strategic objectives.

The incorporations Act of 2012 states that all incorporated associations must have their own set of rules or follow the Model Rules as set out by the act. <u>BRAC's current registration</u> with consumer affairs states that it is guided by the Model Rules of Incorporation, and that it has done so since its incorporation on 18th August 1988.

Whilst the standard Model Rules may serve BRAC well in many regards, they do not appropriately consider some of the unique elements of the association. After a review of what is believed to be our current guiding rules, it appears there may have been minor adjustments to the standard model rules over time that reflect some of the idiosyncrasies of the association, such as changing a member from 'Person' to 'Sporting Club'. It appears as though these minor amendments have not been lodged with (or if so, acknowledged by) Consumer Affairs, and therefore would be invalid.

As such and for the purpose of BRAC considering adopting its own rules, changes noted within this briefing paper will reflect changes from the consumer affairs model rules to BRAC's new Rules of Incorporation.

Further relevant background includes:

- The BRAC Strategic Plan 2023-2026+ was approved in March, recommending a number of key initiatives, some of which will directly require BRAC to adopt its own rules, and others which will require rules to be adopted to align with its strategic objectives.
- In March 2023, the BRAC Committee and Members voted in favour of moving to a skills based strategic board. Whilst the changes to the committee structure were outlined and members were advised that amendments to Model Rules would be required, the specific changes to the rules were not tabled and presented for approval.
